The Landing School Awards scholarships to those who qualify. There are a variety of scholarships that fall into two categories, merit-based scholarships and need-based. Need-based scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis. Qualified students may be awarded both need and merit-based scholarships.

Merit-based scholarships have an application process. The scholarship committee reviews applications and determines awards. Prospective students may apply for multiple scholarships. If the eligibility requirements for the scholarship are not met, the scholarship will not be awarded.
